Now, new 5<sup>th</sup> batch of tailoring centre will start from November 1, 2016 with 25 girls/women. He narrated the future plan to starting of Ready-made Garment Production Centre with support of Government and financial institutions with involvement of trained tailoring centre trainee and upgrades their family income.

Mr. Vanala Prasad, B.A., M.L. Advocate – District Court & Member – District Legal Services Authority, Kurnool narrated the present situation of the girls and women who loss freedom in the society. There is a dire need of women education and empowerment. He applauded the initiative of SEED-SYA to provide free food, accommodation and education of Orphan Girls is a very challenging programme to deserted families.



**Speech by Mr. Vanala Prasad,, Advocate – District Court & Member – District Legal Services Authority, Kurnool**

Mr. Shaik Mastan Vali, M.A., M.PEd., M. Phil., District Minority Welfare Officer & District Youth Welfare Officer Kurnool, congrats to the all SEED funded project beneficiaries and appreciated the progress made so far. He said that Muslim women are particularly far more behind. For example among the Muslim women on All India level, according to the National Family Health Survey (NFHS), 66% are illiterate and in Haryana Muslim female illiteracy is universal (98%). Even in Assam with the highest percentage of Muslim population the female illiteracy among Muslims is 74 per cent. In the states of West Bengal, Karnataka, Delhi and Madhya Pradesh, 60 to 65 per cent and in the states of Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat, 50 to 55 per cent of Muslim women are illiterate. Muslims are paying more attention to education and economic progress. They have also become quite conscious of female education and now more and more Muslim women are taking to education. A large number of Muslims live in urban areas i.e. almost thirty per cent and a large number among the urban Muslims is that of artisans who come from lower castes. As pointed out above it is these lower castes that are more upwardly mobile compared to the mobility of the so called upper caste Muslims. It is because number of artisans are becoming small scale entrepreneurs and benefiting from their professional skills. Further, he explained in details about current central and state government schemes for the development of minorities particularly Dulhan Scheme, Free Residential School Facilities at Kurnool, and Minority Financial Support Loan Schemes for self-employment. He also assured his support and help to the all beneficiaries of the projects of SEED-SYA at time when need arises.
